<u>The Form is due on or before July 31, 2024.</u> As soon as your PSAP has completed all of the compliance requirements, submit your Form to expedite processing.

COMPLIANCE Training EMD/CPR Employment Assurance

REMINDERS:

- Annual Certification of Compliance Forms are NO LONGER accepted electronically.
- Proof of CPR and Emergency Medical Dispatch (EMD) <u>must be included with the FY2024 submission for</u>
 <u>PSAPs that are providing EMD in-house and also for all certified EMD resources.</u>
- For PSAPs who provide EMD, <u>a detailed explanation and sample of documents used for EMD quality</u> assurance must be included.






Erica Adams has joined the Programs team!

Updates from our Fiscal Division



Interview with a Fiscal Specialist:

- Q. How often should I submit my reimbursements?
 - **A.** In compliance with grant guidelines, reimbursements should be submitted within <u>30 days</u> of incurring the costs.
- Q. Do I need to update my awarded application if I receive new/updated quotes from my vendors?
 A. Yes, you should e-mail copies of updated quotes to 911DeptGrants@mass.gov to ensure that all costs on the quote are eligible expenses and ensures that reimbursements can be reconciled to a quote of file. Failing to provide the new/updated quote can lead to delays in processing a reimbursement and/or reductions.
- Q. What documentation is needed to file a reimbursement request?
 - **A**. All reimbursement submissions should contain the completed State 911 Department's current year grant reimbursement **forms**, **proof of payment** for the requested cost and where applicable, **vendor invoices** and proof of **course completion**.
- Q. What if a telecommunicator for whom I wish to seek reimbursement is not noted on the awarded application?
 - **A.** A PSAP may add a certified enhanced 911 telecommunicator following the award of the grant by submitting a request to 911DeptGrants@mass.gov. Said request shall contain the information noted on the Personnel Costs form contained in the Application Package. Such request shall be submitted by an authorized signatory.
- Q. What is the submission deadline to file budget modifications under the FY24 Grants?
 - A. The <u>deadline</u> for filing FY24 budget modifications is <u>March 31, 2024</u>.
- Q. Is training available on the application and/or reimbursement process?
 - A. Yes, the Department hosts virtual training on the application process on the third Monday of every month and on the reimbursement process on the third Wednesday of every month. All sessions begin at 11:00 am. Register by e-mailing 911DeptGrants@mass.gov. One-on-one sessions can also be scheduled by contacting Angela.Pilling@mass.gov.



Updates from our Systems Division

Fire Hydrant Locations

Starting in September 2023, MassGIS placed an active effort into compiling up-to-date hydrant data throughout the Commonwealth of Massachusetts. The locations of the hydrants were gathered through the ESRI ArcGIS Online geospatial database, town websites, fire departments, and municipal GIS offices. The individual hydrant datasets provided were appended into a single list to create this geospatial layer. It was then tested to ensure data quality, including the removal of duplicates. Suspected duplicates were those that were points that were within one meter of another hydrant. Additionally, the hydrants were cross referenced with areal imagery for geospatial accuracy. Thanks to the collaboration between fire chiefs, municipal governments, and GIS teams, the number of municipality data went from 63 to 108. See map below. There are a total of 126,751 hydrants in this layer. The dataset shall be updated quarterly, starting this month. Updates can be sent to Notify911Address@mass.gov with the subject "Hydrant Data".

In the summer of 2022, every K-12 public school district and private school in the Commonwealth was mailed a letter with the following contents:

RE: Active Shooter Response

There were more school-related shooting incidents in 2021 — **thirty-four** (34) — than in any year since at least 1999, the year of the Columbine tragedy, despite most students not attending school for the first two months of 2021. Two hundred and ninety-two thousand (292,000) children at three hundred and ten (310) schools have been impacted by school-related shooting incidents since 1999. Now, more than ever, it is important to ensure that schools have protocols in place to protect students and staff. **Access to 9-1-1 is critical** to making certain that students and staff can count on first responders arriving promptly in an active-shooter incident or other emergency. If a 9-1-1 call initiated from a school displays the address of the town hall instead of the school, or a call shows the administration building instead of the building, floor, and classroom where an active shooter is targeting students, the delay in emergency response time could have tragic consequences.

It has come to our attention that the Multi-Line Telephone Systems (MLTS) serving many public and private schools do not comply with the Commonwealth of Massachusetts' MLTS Regulations as set forth in 560 CMR 4.00. Non-compliance potentially endangers students, staff, and the public. Please also note that on February 16, 2020, the FCC adopted new Federal Regulations (Kari's Law and Section 506 of the RAY BAUM's Act) that became effective per FCC Order FCC-19-76. Parts of the FCC Order have already been incorporated into the updated Commonwealth's MLTS Regulations. There is no waiver of systems for non-compliance.

As a result of non-compliance, many school districts and school systems have already been placed in our MLTS Compliance Program. Please follow the links below in order to determine whether your school district or school(s) is in compliance. Compliance with our MLTS regulations will provide the public, students and staff with prompt, accurate dispatchable location information for first responders in the event of an active shooter or other emergency. In order to help your school district or school (s) achieve compliance, the State 911 Department offers twicemonthly MLTS educational workshops that we would encourage you to participate in.

Recipients of the letter were advised to take a pro-active approach to school and public safety by reviewing the MLTS Regulations and related educational materials on our website. They were also invited to attend one of our online educational MLTS Workshops.

Since the letter was mailed, the following K-12 public school districts and private schools have completed the process of bringing their schools into compliance:
