

EMERALD ASH BORER

Recently discovered in Massachusetts. Devastates ash tree species. A bright metallic green beetle, 0.5 inches-long, with flattened





back. Larvae of beetle within ash trees do the damage.

Signs: ash tree canopy die-back, bark splitting, D-shaped exit holes and increased woodpecker activity and dam-

ASIAN LONG-HORNED BEETLE

Recently discovered in the Worcester, MA area. Devastates maple, willow and elm trees. Adult beetle has long antennae, white spots and light blue legs.
